# **Program Profile**

Due on 2/1, Present in Class

### **Overview**

For this project, you will create and present a profile of one writing program NOT at Ball State. For the purposes of this project a writing program may include: a first-year writing program, a writing across the curriculum program, a writing center, or other similar program. It does NOT include courses, such as writing intensive courses that have no coordinator/director.

## **Purpose**

The purpose of this project is to expand our knowledge of the types of writing programs that exist, how they are organized and structured, and how context affects a program.

The project is particularly designed to meet the following overall course goal:

• Have an understanding of how institutional context may shape a writing program

## **Steps**

- 1) Make a short list of programs
- 2) Contact WPA for your first choice to see if they are available for an interview
- 3) Set up interview (must be synchronous)
- 4) Gather all the info you can about the program online
- 5) Get the rest in an interview
- 6) Create your profile
- 7) Present your profile

#### **Format**

We will use a common format as a class. Here is my suggestion, but we can modify it as we go.

- Institutional Type
- Location
- Reporting Structure & Operations
- WPA Profile
- Budget/Funded by
- Enrollment
- Description of Students
- Program Snapshot
- Brief History of Program
- Assessment
- Role of Research

- Theory that informs the program
- Future Direction/Anticipated Changes
- Appendix: Links to website, key documents

## **Grading (20% of course grade)**

You will be graded primarily on your written profile and the research you have done to write it. The presentation in class will be informal, but we will determine a common format for these.

Context is the key to your project. A passing (B-level) project will clearly outline the key aspects of the program as listed above. However, a strong project (A-level) will show how these pieces fit together, particularly how institutional context affects everything else.
